1. Call to Order

Commission chair Paul Ericsson called the meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. in room A of the Watertown Community Center.

Members present: Ericsson, Jim Sandquist, Cindy Raymond, Dave Smith, and Lynn Tschudi.

2. Adopt Agenda (motion needed)

SANDQUIST MOVED, RAYMOND SECONDED A MOTION TO ADOPT THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED. ALL PRESENT VOTED AYE, MOTION CARRIED.

5. New Business

A. Senior Dance - May 2, 2020

1. Flyer Distribution

Raymond asked if Tschudi could remove the word POLKA from the flyer. Tschudi would like to leave it being that the Wendinger band is a "POLKA" band. She asked about changing the word "senior" as not to be confused with a high school senior. Sandquist stated there should not be confusion as the Commission on Aging is the host.

Raymond asked Tschudi if the band could play music other than POLKA. Tschudi agreed to email the band to ask.

2. Update on snacks

Tschudi updated that she has not heard any updates on snacks. The commission agreed to hold tight until next meeting.

3. Update on helpers

B. Holiday Dinner Entertainment - Cindy Raymond

Raymond suggested hiring a soloist or trio to play at the Holiday Dinner while guests are eating. Ericsson stated he likes not having music all the time so people do not have to talk over music or worry about their hearing aids if they have them. Tschudi asked Raymond to bring the topic back up in October.

Raymond said she has not heard anything about becoming Dementia Friendly lately. She would like to hear more about the process possibly from Carver County. Commission decided to discuss this topic with the larger group.
